Your support has once more made possible to enjoy yet another successful year at The Walk!

As Community Parks Officer for Bournemouth East, it has been a great pleasure to see this Open Space improving every year since the formation of the FFW. The many events that have taken place have proved very popular and extremely well organized.

The work that have taken place over the past 12 months has seen

For those interested in wildlife, at this time of year watch out for birds using the bird boxes we installed in 2008– this is nest building time! From March, look out for the brown-grey Speckled Wood Butterflies, with the males locked in their graceful spiraling clashes over defence of their

the addition of the beautifully carved nature posts which have inspired interest– children particularly love to touch the shapes of the animals on the wood! The posts carry great local significance as the wood was sourced from trees felled in Queens Park– a great example of recycling!

Over 100,000 bluebell seeds have been sown over large areas in the site, although sadly we will not see the flowers for at least a couple of years. When they do flower, they will provide magnificent

territories. Also, although it is sometimes difficult to distinguish the different species of blue butterflies, watch for the Holly Blue, the first ones to appear each spring.

If you have children, they will enjoy investigating the plants around the edges of the pond from late spring onwards– they may find the skins shed by the dragonflies as

bluebell woodland which I believe will rival any other bluebell wood in the area– and attract even more visitors!

Following the improvements which have taken place, there has been a marked decrease in graffiti, and dog fouling is happening less (perhaps also because several fines have been issued for failure to “pick up”). These are positive signs that the Walk and other users are being increasingly respected.!!
